#### 30/24 Head teachers' report

The Head teacher's report was uploaded on TEAMS prior to the meeting. DS gave the following headlines:

- There has been a fairly settled return to the new term with fewer absences recorded at the start of term with mainly support staff having a couple of days due to illness.
- One member of staff is due to go on maternity leave in May (after SATS) and two staff members are returning from maternity leave over the next term.
- The school have secured a Y5 supply teacher to remain in KS2 for the next year to cover maternity leave.
- Support staff continue to receive CPD for Phonics in KS1 and KS2 staff are receiving reading, writing and maths support to ensure quality support is given when they are delivering interventions for small groups of pupils.
- A learning environment monitoring and book monitoring was completed this last term, and the school have completed a data check.

- Lesson monitoring will be a drop-in to a maths lesson and a report completed straight after Easter break.
- **Intervention** support Catch up clubs have recommenced and are running well for Y2 (20) and Y5 (14).
- Administrative support the apprentice is successfully trained in website management. A decision needs to be made regarding funding to retain her post Easter.
- Trips and Activities:
  - o Forest school learning has been with Y2 and Y4 this term.
  - Weekly swimming has been provided for Y3 and Y5.
  - Visits to Skipton Castle (Y2), Cliffe Castle (Y3 & Y5) and an upcoming Ribble Valley river walk (Y4).
  - Next term there are two residentials Nell Bank (Y3) and Buckden Hall (Y5).
- **Workshops** have run in the school by Yorkshire Band of Hope on drug awareness, positive choices and county lines (KS2).
- Extracurricular After school Karate club is subsidised and runs on a Friday with a small cost to families.
- In the final weeks of term there will be:
  - Y3 and Y4 performance of the Pirates Vs Mermaids.
  - o Easter service in church.
- SIP Priority One Quality of Education:
  - Consistent phonics delivery and a strong KS1 to KS2 transition.
  - The Spring assessment shows reading across school is at least Good if not better.
  - Fixing Fluency interventions (Y4 & Y5) has improved reading speed, fluency and confidence.
  - The Educational Psychologist is assessing the lowest 20% of Y3 readers to tailor interventions.
  - Y6 pupils participated in a national broadcast for the BBC World Book Day Live Session.
  - Writing:
    - Handwriting and presentation have improved significantly.
    - Short burst writing and cross-curricular writing are stronger.
    - Spelling remains a focus area, particularly in two classes.
    - CPD English consultant Alison Philipson has visited school to moderate writing with teachers provide CPD on how to assess writing.

#### Staffing update:

- One support staff resignation.
- Two staff returning from maternity, one new staff member to start maternity leave in May.
- One support staff is on long-term absence due to a shoulder injury.
- There are no current staff vacancies, but a decision is needed on whether to retain the apprentice administrator.

#### Safeguarding and Behaviour:

- o There have been no exclusions this term.
- o There is targeted support for challenging SEND needs.
- Great Minds Together is helping support students with SEMH.

#### Bullying and Racism:

- Friendship issues in Y6 and Y4 are being managed through pastoral interventions.
- There has been one incident of racist language (online gaming) which has been addressed with the PCSO and parents.

#### • GDPR Compliance:

- There have been no data breaches.
- GDPR has been reviewed within the Finance committee and all policies are compliant.

#### • Health & Safety:

- Termly site risk assessments have been completed.
- o The recent fire drill took 2 minutes 22 seconds for evacuation.
- Rodent control visits are ongoing.
- The Road Safety team are in school this term to deliver roadside training with Y3 and workshops/assemblies with classes across school.
- Targeted staff have completed fire safety training via Smartlog, and all staff are completing Food Hygiene training.

#### • Site & Premises update:

- New gym equipment has been installed, replacing the Trim Trail. Younger pupils will need supervision and support when using the equipment.
- Rubber matting is to be extended across the whole area to allow grass to grow through when very wet and avoiding mud patches.
- There has been a reduction in rodent activity over the winter months, but monitoring continues.
- The site manager will be on sickness leave from mid-March for possibly 6 – 8 weeks. The assistant site manager and a cleaner/lunchtime supervisor will be covering during his absence.

#### Upcoming refurbishments:

- Year 5/Year 6 boys toilets are in a poor condition.
- Year2/3 girls toilets are due to be updated (10 years old).
- Both are financially dependent on funds available.

#### • Leadership & Management:

- The governors are actively engaged in whole school monitoring and the subject leader feedback cycle is initiated.
- CPD review and timetable for 2025 to include areas in need of development – reading and maths to be updated more frequently to address areas of weakness.
- HTPM year end and new targets set for 2025/26.
- Leaders have high expectations of pupils to ensure consistency and better outcomes.

#### • Resources & Budget update:

- A draft budget for 2025/26 has been started.
- Decisions for governors regarding Maternity insurance following the local authority decision to stop providing the service.
- SFVS has been uploaded to FGB and is ready to be signed off.

  - Funding Pastoral support with social and emotional wee-being, including delivery of My Happy Mind by class teachers.
  - The provision of Breakfast Club to 25 vulnerable pupils.
  - Subsidisation of trips.
  - After school catch-up clubs targeting pupil premium pupils.
